**Rx: Purim** by Rabbi Leana Moritt

You don't have to be glued to cable news to know that we live in tense and troubling times. Whether local, national or global, our Jewish tradition demands that we work toward justice, and for this we are proudly engaged. However, for those of us who take this demand seriously, it is all too easy to be overwhelmed by the needs of so many and the cries of injustice that demand our attention and pull on our conscience.

The more I think about this, the more I realize the tremendous wisdom of our tradition to speak to our emotional and spiritual needs in this area. Specifically, while we have a weekly break on Shabbat from the woes of the world, it's Purim that lets out the stops and releases our inner pressure cooker—through joy and laughter. "*A joyful heart is good medicine, but a crushed spirit dries up the bones.*" - Proverbs 17:22.

Certainly, we live in trying times, but just as certainly, generations of Jews before us were no stranger to bigotry, famine, degradation, pogroms, disease, exile, mass murder, injustice and much, much more. Yet, in every generation, we also had the revelry and joy of Purim, and this, along with Shabbat, is arguably what has saved us.

Purim: our yearly topsy-turvy, noise-making, side-splitting-laughing; gift-giving, schnapps-drinking, cross-dressing, merrymaking holiday that comes up on Monday March 9. Not only is all this activity a mitzvah on Purim, but this is good medicines for our weary and media-oversaturated souls.

The UK's Rabbi Lord Jonathan Sacks recounts an interaction with a Holocaust survivor who taught him this valuable lesson. Commenting on Roberto Begnini's comedy about the Holocaust, *Life is Beautiful*, he shared that while he agreed with Begnini's thesis—a sense of humor keeps you sane—that was not enough in Auschwitz to keep you alive.

"On that, you are wrong," the survivor told him, and then shared this story: He had been in Auschwitz, and he soon realized that if he failed to keep his spirits up, he would die. So, he made a pact with another young man that they would both look out, each day, for some occurrence they found amusing. At the end of each day they would tell one another their story and they would laugh together. "That sense of humor saved my life," he said. The rabbi stood corrected. He was right.

Purim is the day we shed our huddled winter blues and let our inner child come out and play. We take this fun very seriously. So, how do you reap and spread the joy at Temple Beth-El?

- **Give Purim Bags/Mishloach Manot.** Purim is a gift-giving holiday. We make it easy by packing and delivering gift bags of mishloach manot for all our members. Your role: Go to <http://www.betheljc.org/purim> to contribute to this holiday fundraiser (and funraiser!). - **Be in the shpiel.** Ham it up with us as we act out the Story of Queen Esther, Evil Haman and valiant Mordechai. This year, we're parodying Fiddler On The Roof (come on, you know you know all the songs!)
- **Dress up.** Not just for children. Be creative. Who or what do you want to be this year?
- **Eat a hamantashen or savor a shot of schnapps.** Or both (if you are over 21.) Yes, that is a mitzvah too.
- **Laugh and sing along with our shpielers.** Believe me, none of us are professionals up there. We are just having a little unselfconscious fun! Be patient. Our sound system could use an upgrade, so sing extra loud.
- **Bring your kids—but for goodness sakes, don't believe it is just for them. Join us for the happiest day of the year. Goodness knows, we need it and deserve it.** Chag Purim sameach! A happy and joyous Purim to us all!

# Member Spotlight

Vadim and Anna  
Ivanov



Maybe you've never met Anna and Vadim Ivanov; they often work at Beth El during the week, when no one else is around. But if you have stopped by for a service anytime in the past half decade or so, you certainly have enjoyed the fruit of their labors. Anna works in Beth-El's tiny office just off the main sanctuary. She keeps the calendar updated, maintains correspondence, keeps up with accounting, all the work that is invisible to most of the congregation but is necessary to keep everything running smoothly.

Vadim, does, in his own words, "everything" — from fixing holes in the floor, to running the internet wiring, to fixing the plumbing. He even remodeled the balcony area to make room for classroom space. "If you don't need a license, I'll do it," the engineer and jack of all trades told me. He also makes sure the temple is secure and safe. "People feel safer when they see Vadim," Anna told me.

Jersey City has been home to the couple for almost as long as they've been in the United States. When they first moved to the United States from Russia, they tried Brooklyn but found it, according to Anna, "too crazy." Jersey City was quieter, a better fit. One day, Vadim was walking around his new neighborhood and noticed a stately old building on Kennedy Boulevard. He didn't know it was a temple at first. The next time he walked by, he realized what he had come across. He walked right into the unfamiliar synagogue in a brand-new country, met the president of the congregation and said, "If you need help, I can help you."

A man of his word, Vadim is helping now more than ever as an official contractor with the temple, following several years of volunteering. "I know everything that happens here," he said.

His wife Anna has also given much time and energy to Beth El. In another life, Anna was a model, and she still works in the industry, running fashion shows and events. She uses those same skills to help out at Beth-El events. In November she gamely took on Beth-El's administrative tasks as well. "If I can help, why not?" she told me.

Anna told me that many people do appreciate what she and Vadim do for the temple and congregation, but she doesn't mind staying backstage at Beth-El. After seven or so years of service, no thanks is needed. "You can feel the community", she says. When I asked Vadim why he is willing to give so much of his time and energy to a frustrating, crumbling, almost-100-year-old building, he said "I like this place. It's my second home."


